Hope Stories From Native America

Savannah, a Hopi girl raised in a very traditional family on the top of the mesa. Her father carved Kachinas and her mom sold to tourists. She was given the personal choice from almost 4 years old to decide to come to the Hopi Christian Camp youth ministry she did. She has come every year since then and she heard Jesus stories! She went through a very hard time this 6th grade but remembered these. It helped her graduate as a Top 10!

1st - Sow the Seed of His Word



Joshua, a Navajo/Pueblo

young man, lost his mom at an early age which led his father into such grief that he left too! He and his brother tried to take care of themselves only for it to end in substance use and the sale of it. But a Christian Grandma offered the Hope of Christ and he responded in faith. He went with us on a month long mission trip to offer this Hope Response to 18 tribes sharing his Hope Story! He went on to graduate from Indian Bible College and works with the students.

2nd - Born Again and Growing



Dione, a Salt River Pima

young lady remembers their family's life before and after Christ yet she was intent to "do her OWN thing!" Running with the crowd resulted in pain and conflict yet ended with a plea to God. He answered! She set her mind then to use her freedom to speak to other youth with us on a Hope Response road trip to many tribes.



God gave her a "voice" for Him and she went on to serve on the youth council of SRP, then onto Washington DC as a summer intern with our congressman. She now studies at GCU in political science. She joined us on a Puerto Rico disaster response trip. Her family hosted exchange students for 3 years to share Christ one-on-one of which this summer is being spent with a sister student in Vietnam!

Pastor Abel, Hopi Tribe, has ministered faithfully God's Word over the years, driving weekly from Phoenix to his Hopi people every weekend for over 10 years. He has worked with us side-by-side at the Hopi Christian Camp. He graduated June 4th to be with His Savior Jesus Christ and His Creator Father God!

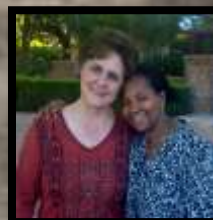


Join us...on a "Prayer Journey"

- Aug 1- 4 Ministry activities in Nyarugusu Refugee Camp (115,000 Congolese/Burundians)
- Aug 5 Fly back to Arusha, Tanzania
- Aug 6-7 Visit to Ngorongoro National Park a World Heritage, relocated home of Maasai Tribe
- Aug 8-9 Local outreach visitations and home visits
- Aug 10-11 Good-bye to church family, host family and community; return trip preparation
- Aug 12-14 Fly back to USA via Ethiopia, Addis Ababa to Chicago, IL to Phoenix, AZ (34 hours)
