This comfort is what our multicultural youth team took to the
Cocopah Indian Reservation, the
Hualapai Tribe and the Hopi Tribe
July1-11. We combined the
message with puppets, crafts,
games, singing and small groups.
The HOPE Response to Loss, Pain
and Grief is best learned by the
youth sharing their own personal
"Hope Stories" of how Christ
made a difference in their life.
We walked through each session
with a different deep question to
relate to such as: Does God



really care about my pain? Why God have you allowed this? Why do I feel so bad? How do you know when someone needs help? Why me? Does God even hear me when I pray? What do I do with this pain? How do I find healing? Where do I belong? And what's next in my life after

there were 200
that heard the
message of
Christ's hope
with many
different

responses! There were youth and adults who expressed hope in just hearing the Word of God about the real pain they were facing right then. Mt.22:29, Jesus replied, "You are in error because you do not know the Scriptures or the power of God." As witnesses, our story shows His power and the Scriptures are true moving people to follow Jesus so that they can have His hope. The youth learned to share Christ hope response themselves.
